

Noun Showdown – Plurals

- Everyone gets a stack of 10 index cards. Each card should be used for 4 words.
- The singular noun cards are placed face down in the center of the table.
- The leader picks up a card and reads the singular noun.
- Students write the noun on their index card in plural form.
- As each person finishes, they place their index card face down. When all index cards are face down, the leader says "Showdown!" and everyone shows their answer.
- The leader checks the answers according to the sentence card, students write corrections if needed.
- Play until all 40 nouns have been used.
